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in this revised and greatly expanded edition of the companion 80 scholars come together to offer an original and far reaching assessment of English Renaissance literature and culture a new edition of the best selling companion to English Renaissance literature revised and updated with 22 new essays and 19 new illustrations contributions from some 80 scholars including Judith H. Anderson, Patrick Collinson, Alison Findlay, Germaine Greer, Malcolm Jones, Arthur Kinney, James Knowles, Arthur Marotti, Robert Miola, and Greg Walker. Unrivalled in scope and its exploration of unfamiliar literary and cultural territories the companion offers new readings of both literary and non-literary texts. Features essays discussing material culture, sectarian writing, the history of the body, theatre both in and outside the playhouses, law, gardens, and ecology in early modern England. Orientates the beginning student while providing advanced students and faculty with new directions for their research. All of the essays from the first edition along with the recommendations for further reading have been reworked or updated.

This comprehensive anthology collects together primary texts and documents relevant to the literature, culture, and intellectual life in England between 1550 and 1660.

This book reassesses Renaissance English literature and its place in Elizabethan society. It examines in particular the role of Italianate literary imitation in addressing the ethical and political issues of the sixteenth century.

early modern english literature abounds with archaeological images from open graves to ruined monasteries schwyzer demonstrates that archaeology can shed light on literary texts including works by spenser shakespeare and donne the book also explores the kinship between two disciplines distinguished by their intimacy with the traces of past life

what was the purpose of representing foreign lands for writers in the english renaissance this innovative and wide ranging study argues that writers often used their works as vehicles to reflect on the state of contemporary english politics particularly their own lack of representation in public institutions sometimes such analyses took the form of displaced allegories whereby writers contrasted the advantages enjoyed or disadvantages suffered by foreign subjects with the political conditions of tudor and stuart england elsewhere more often in explicitly colonial writings authors meditated on the problems of government when faced with the possibly violent creation of a new society if venice was commonly held up as a beacon of republican liberty which england would do well to imitate the fear of tyrannical catholic spain was ever present inspiring and haunting much of the colonial literature from 1580 onwards this stimulating book examines fictional and non fictional writings illustrating both the close connections between the two made by early modern readers and the problems involved in the usual assumption that we can make sense of the past with the categories available to us hadfield explores in his work representations of europe the americas africa and the far east selecting pertinent examples rather than attempting to embrace a total coverage he also offers fresh readings of shakespeare marlowe more lyly hakluyt harriot nashe and others

this comprehensive guide to the historical and cultural context of english literature covers the core periods of literature and history from the english renaissance to the present peter widdowson introduces and outlines key terms concepts and developments and provides a series of timelines showing political social cultural and literary events for each year together this indispensable reference work offers a concise history of britain for literature students at all levels and provides readers with the context for any literary work from 1500 to 2000 the palgrave guide to english literature and its contexts 1500 2000 covers a wide range of canonical british authors and works but also provides contextualising examples of works from other countries each chapter focuses on a key period in english literature and history gives a brief overview of that period and defines the main terms and ideas of the age contains easy to follow timelines which may be viewed either horizontally or vertically allowing readers to track a chronological history or single out the developments and events of a specific year

english poetry in the first half of the seventeenth century is an outstandingly rich and varied body of verse which can be understood and appreciated more fully when set in its cultural and ideological context this student companion consisting of fourteen new introductory essays by scholars of international standing informs and illuminates the poetry by providing close reading of texts and an exploration of their background there are individual studies of donne jonson herrick herbert carew suckling lovelace milton crashaw vaughan and marvell more general essays describe the political and religious context of the poetry explore its gender politics explain the material circumstances of its production and circulation trace its larger role in the development of genre and tradition and relate it to contemporary rhetorical expectation overall the companion provides an indispensable guide to the texts and contexts of early seventeenth century english poetry

the oxford history of classical reception ohcrel is designed to offer a comprehensive investigation of the numerous and diverse ways in which literary texts of the classical world have stimulated responses and refashioning by english writers covering the full range of english literature from the early middle ages to the present day ohcrel both synthesizes existing scholarship and presents cutting edge new research employing an international team of expert contributors for each of the five volumes ohcrel endeavours to interrogate rather than inertly reiterate conventional assumptions about literary periods the processes of canon formation and the relations between literary and non literary discourse it conceives of reception as a complex process of dialogic exchange and rather than offering large cultural generalizations it engages in close critical analysis of literary texts it explores in detail the ways in which english writers engagement with classical literature casts as much light on the classical originals as it does on the english writers own cultural context this second volume and third to appear in the series covers the years 1558 1660 and explores the reception of the ancient genres and authors in english renaissance literature engaging with the major and many of the minor writers of the period including shakespeare marlowe spenser and jonson separate chapters examine the renaissance institutions and contexts which shape the reception of antiquity and an annotated bibliography provides substantial material for further reading

this concise companion launches students into the study of english renaissance literature through the central contexts that informed it places the poetry within contexts such as economics religion empire and exploration education humanism and rhetoric censorship and patronage royal marriage and succession treason and rebellion others in england private lives cosmology and the body and life writing incorporates recent developments in the field as well as work soon to be published entices students to explore the subject further provides new syntheses that will be of interest to scholars all the contributors are highly regarded scholars and teachers

this ambitious undertaking is designed to acquaint students teachers and researchers with reference sources in any branch of english studies which marcuse defines as all those subjects and lines of critical and scholarly inquiry presently pursued by members of university departments of english language and literature within each of 24 major sections marcuse lists and annotates bibliographies guides reviews of research encyclopedias dictionaries journals and reference histories the annotations and various indexes are models of clarity and usefulness and cross references are liberally supplied where appropriate although cost conscious librarians will probably consider the several other excellent literary bibliographies in print such as james l harner s literary research guide modern language assn of america 1989 larger academic libraries will want marcuse s volume jack bales mary washington coll lib fredericksburg va library journal

including authoritative texts of poems by twenty three major and minor poets from john donne edmund spenser william shakespeare and ben jonson to george gascoigne and fulke greville and williams critical preface english renaissance poetry remains an invaluable introductory anthology of short poems from our first modern poetry

a guide to english literature from 1500 to 1660 it combines a series of critical essays on understanding renaissance literature elizabethan and jacobean drama renaissance poetry and the contemporary historical background with a complimentary a to z section of detailed entries this up to date alphabetical section includes references to and bibliographies for major authors plot summaries and critical discussions of principal works glossaries of important literary terms and supplementary theoretical background material a full chronology is also provided and comprehensive cross referencing occurs throughout the book
